- 1) The termination of the instant proceedings as of February 8, 1957, and
- (2) The appointment of Receivers to take possession of the property as of February 9, 1957.

The effective time of transfer will be midnight February 8, 1957.

For your contributions during the past three years, my sincere gratitude.

Dead-flame Lantern

This type of lantern was designed to eliminate, or minimize, the effect of drafts on the flame. A series of baffles inside the top (bell) above the top of the globe was positioned so that no top draft or wind could blow directly on the flame. Furthermore, bottom-draft holes were sized and located so that wind blown against the base was deflected by the font and the globe base. This moderately controlled air flow resulted in a uniform, relatively nonflickering flame.
